Building a valuable and more interesting website for VHAA

We would like to ensure that our VHAA website (verdugoarts.org) is both valuable and interesting for members and guests. To that end, we not only provide information on upcoming activities, we also provide reviews and photo galleries of recent demonstrations, workshops, and exhibitions. Angela Alvarenga and Suzanne Bitterman (verdugoarts.org/a-fantastic-2017-2018-final-meeting.html) have written excellent reviews of recent Friday night meetings, and Pepe Apablaza's photographs show demonstrators at work, often providing views just as good as the ones attendees see on our big screen. These reviews are always interesting, and often share valuable lessons that our demonstrators have offered.

In addition to information on our club activities, we have built the website to share information and photographs of member activities. This section of the website includes member portfolios (verdugoarts.org/portfolios.html) and current member activities (verdugoarts.org/member-activities.html). On the current member activities page, for example, you will find an announcement and flyer describing Joan Whitmore's participation in an exhibition, running through mid-August, at the Rosebud Café in Pasadena.

We have also created a page with links to interesting art articles gathered from a variety of sources (verdugoarts.org/fun-reads.html). Some of the articles offer instruction (e.g., "How to Paint with Negative Space" and "What to Leave In, What to Take Out"), some provide links to valuable resources (e.g., "Free art books for members who like electronic books"), and some provide links to galleries worth viewing (e.g., "Best designed street murals in the world").

With all of that said, we would like to get more of our members involved in helping to build on the site's current content. For example, we would like to add illustrations of the work of more of our members. If you want to have your own page on our website all you need to do is send us photos of 2 or 3 of your artworks, plus a very brief Artist Statement. We will create a page much like this one we made for Marie Castellano - verdugoarts.org/marie-castellano.html.

Also, we are happy to create a page for you if you are participating in an exhibition or some other activity. Simply send a few sentences about it, and even a flyer or photograph if you would like, and we can create an announcement page like the one we did for Joan Whitmore.
