Richard E. Scott, ASLA, ASAI, is a licensed landscape architect, architectural illustrator, teacher, watercolorist, oil painter and author. He has taught in the Landscape Architecture Departments at Cal-Poly, Pomona, UCLA Extension, and in Environmental Design at Art Center in Pasadena. Richard's goal is to communicate the lessons he has learned working on literally thousands of renderings for hundreds of projects, and to teach designers how to apply these lessons to improve the quality of their own work. His students enjoy his energetic and fun teaching style and highly organized classes. They appreciate his focus on improving the skill of each student every session, and his genuine concern for the success of each student. 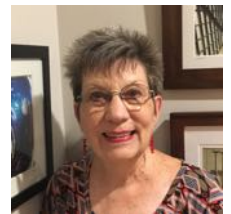
At our September meeting, Richard will be critiquing members' paintings. He has served as a juror for us in the past and gave wonderful information to the few people present on how he chose the "winners." Richard reported that this is what he looks for when judging paintings: "a compelling subject matter—not what it *is* (still life, figure, landscape), but what it *looks like* (interesting abstract shapes and colors); clarity of expression (simplicity in composition); skillful relationships (of geometric shapes, tonal values, colors and edges)." Members may bring 2 paintings, and we'll do our best to be sure at least one gets critiqued. You won't want to miss the valuable insights he will share. Come early to get a good seat!

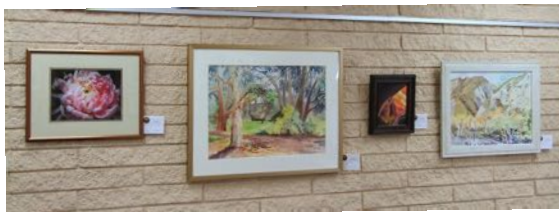
